SOCIAL AND ECONOMIC ASPECTS OF FORESTRY SECTOR





Social and Economic Aspects of Forestry Sector

The social and economic fabric woven around forestry is an important indicator of association of people with forests. Schemes such as Joint Forest Management invite peoples' participation in management of forests with the forest department. There are a number of Village Forest Committees (VFCs) that work in tandem with the forest personnel in managing the forests sustainably. The total number of JFM Committees in the country along with the area under their management if given in table 5.1. The plan outlay in forestry and wildlife sector is also included in this section. The interaction of forests and society has increased manifold in the past. Many states launched Social forestry / Community Forestry Programmes during late 1970s and early 1980s under externally aided projects for undertaking afforestation in private and community owned barren and degraded lands with the active co-operation and involvement of local population and created Social Forestry wings.

Plantation under Twenty Point Programme

The 20-Point Programme (TPP) was restructured again in 2006 in conformity with the priorities of the Government as contained in the National Common Minimum Programme (NCMP). The restructured Programme is called Twenty Point Programme 2006 (TPP-2006). The physical target of tree plantation under 20-Point Programme (TPP) is fixed by the Ministry of Environment and Forests in consultation with the States/UTs and progress is monitored (Table 5.5).

National Afforestation Programme

This programme is the main programme of the Government of India with an aim to increase tree and forest cover. Launched in 2002, the programme was initiated by merging four schemes of the Ministry of Environment & Forests in 9th Five Year Plan, i.e., Integrated Afforestation and Eco-Development Projects Scheme (IAEPS), Area Oriented Fuelwood and Fodder Projects Scheme (AOFFPS), Conservation and Development of Non-Timber Forest Produce including Medicinal Plants Scheme (NTFP) and Association of Scheduled Tribes and Rural Poor in Regeneration of Degraded Forests (ASTRP). This also led to reduce the presence of many schemes which generally resulted in delays in disbursement of funds to the field. The data tables in this issue have also been modified accordingly. The merger of the schemes also helped in institutionalising people's participation in project formulation and execution. The scheme is being implemented by the National Afforestation and Eco-Development Board, Ministry of Environment and Forests as a Centrally Sponsored Scheme (Table 5.2).

Realizing the role of forests in the sustainable development of our economy by acting as a defence against environmental degradation, pollution, etc., the 12th Finance Commission, for the first time,



provided a grant of ` 1000 crore to be distributed amongst the states during 2005-10. The 13th Finance Commission felt the need to carry on the grant beyond this period. The funds are directly remitted to the states by the Finance Ministry.

Biodiversity Management Committees have been created as an outcome of the Biodiversity Act 2002 by local bodies for implementation of the act. The committees prepare **People's Biodiversity Registers**. A total of 31542 BMCs have been created so far in 14 states (Table 5.8).
