Indian Council of Forestry Research and Education (ICFRE), has established eight regional institutes in different bio geographical zones of the country. Rain Forest Research Institute is situated in the Jorhat District of Assam in the North eastern part of India. The Institute came into existence in April 1988, although its origin dated back to 1976 when a Regional Centre of Forest Research Institute, Dehra Dun, was established at Burnihat (Assam) to extend knowledge on forestry related issues through research, education and extension in general and to support forestry research in north eastern states of Arunachal Pradesh, Assam, Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Nagaland and Tripura. The Centre advanced steadily in terms of infrastructure and established itself as a nucleus for research on forestry and ecology related issues of the region. Recognising the importance and excellence of the Centre, ICFRE upgraded it to a full-fledged Institute in 1998, originally known as Institute of Rain and Moist Deciduous Forest Research (IRMDER) and now known as the Rain Forest Research Institute (RFRI). In the recent past, the council has included Sikkim under its jurisdiction. The Institute has evolved into one of repute, delivering yeoman service in the field of forestry resources and technology extension to all NE states including Sikkim. The multidisciplinary scientific manpower of the Institute delivers need based technological achievements in forestry science leading towards conservation, protection, eco-restoration and management of forest resources. The tested technologies, developed under different research projects, are transferred to the stakeholders through its Regional Capacity Building Programmes under Demo Village and Van Vigyan Kendras (VVKs) in the states.

The headquarters of the Institute is located at Jorhat in Assam. An Advanced Research Centre for Bamboo and Rattan (ARCBR) has been established at Aizwal in Mizoram in the year 2004.

#### Advanced Research Centre for Bamboo and Rattan (ARCBR)

The ARCBR was established in Aizawl (Mizoram) as a unit of the Rain Forest Research Institute, Jorhat as per the decisions of Standing Finance Committee, Ministry of Environment & Forest, Govt. of India in its meeting dated 26<sup>th</sup> August 2004. The Centre was formally started with the foundation stone laid by Hon'ble Minister of State Shri Namo Narayan Meena, Ministry of Environment and Forests, Govt. of India on 29<sup>th</sup> Nov. 2004 at Bethlehem Vengthlang, Aizawl.



#### **ORGANIZATION**

Rain Forest Research Institute is headed by a Director, who is assisted by Group Coordinator Research, Coordinator Facilities, Controller, a team of Scientists and other research and administrative staff. In order to achieve the objective systematically, the institute has seven Research Divisions with well equipped laboratories viz. Silviculture and Forest Management, Forest Protection, Ecology and Biodiversity, Shifting Cultivation, Bioprospecting and Indigenous Knowledge, Biotechnology and Genetics Division and Forestry Extension Division. Besides, a well equipped Tissue Culture Laboratory established in Biotechnology and Genetics Division to undertake advanced research and technology development activities for micro-propagation of important forestry species and one GIS laboratory in Ecology and Biodiversity Division. RFRI has also established a model nursery for the production of quality planting stock, demonstration, training technology development and for day to day research activities. It includes mist chamber, shade house, net house, green house, composting unit (both organic and vermicompost) etc.

### Library

## IT Cell

#### **GIS Lab**

The Geoinformatics laboratory is well equipped with state of the art technologies and equipments. The hardware includes HP A0 size plotter, IBM server, Computer workstation, GPS receiver machine, printers etc. The software includes the latest version of GIS software (Arc GIS Package) and DIP Software (ERDAS Imagine) along with data and efficient live wares.

#### **Scientist Hostel & Farmers' Hostel**

A newly constructed Scientist Hostel with six double room suits, twelve double bedded rooms and four dormitories in addition to a lecture hall well equipped with internet connections was inaugurated on 27<sup>th</sup> June, 2009. A farmers' hostel is also built up with 25 beds for accommodating farmers, students, and other target communities. A full-fledged Office canteen is also functioning.

#### Community hall & Auditorium building

The institute has now come up with a new Community hall and an Auditorium building with a capacity of 100 persons in each facility which will meet the need of the Institute as well as of the residents living in the campus. The buildings are expected to be fully operational from 2012 onwards.

#### **FRI University Centre**

RFRI is also a center for Forest Research Institute (FRI) University under ICFRE and offers Doctor of Philosophy program in different fields of Forestry and Environment. Research leading to Ph. D may be

carried out in silviculture, seed technology, tree genetics, botany, pathology, entomology, soil sciences, biodiversity, ecology & environment, forest management, wood science & technology, chemistry of forest products, pulp & paper technology, forest extension & sociology, and other related fields. The institute also offers Junior and Senior Research Fellowships on the availability of funds under externally aided and in-house projects. Some institutional staffs and students from outside are already registered for Ph. D. The Centre also organizes entrance exam for the applicants from Northeastern states for admission into various forestry related post graduate courses of the FRI University.

#### **Forestry Extension Division**

The extension Division is aimed to galvanize the Institute –Stakeholder liaison and interaction for effective dissemination of developed, tested and implementable technologies to the end users. The division focuses on awareness generation, dissemination of knowledge and technologies to the user communities, field documentation and interactive meets on new applied research findings and act as a platform for technology transfer from lab to land and capacity building of SFDs, JFMCs, Farmers, SHGs, NGOs and entrepreneurs to strengthen the extension mechanism. Further, it may explore the possibilities and opportunities for market development for forest products and employment and income generation for unemployed youth.

#### **DEMO VILLAGE**

In view the ICFRE guidelines to establishing a DEMO VILLAGE, extensive surveys were conducted in Jorhat and adjoining districts of Assam for selection of a suitable village cluster consisting of various target groups.

The Meleng Grant village cluster adjacent to the Gibbon Wild Life Sanctuary in Jorhat Distt., comprises of three villages *viz*. Bhogpur, Madhupur and Govindpur with a total of 222 households was identified as a potential site to work with variety of rural target groups.

Demonstration of the tested technologies along with On-farm participatory research at Meleng Grant has been a great opportunity for RFRI to publicize its R&D activities. The local, regional, national and international visitors to the sanctuary have also come to know about the research and demonstration activities of RFRI while travelling through the villages.

In regard to the community priorities within the mandate of RFRI, the aims and objectives of the program were finalized as below -

#### **Aims & Objectives**

- To provide sustainable livelihood alternatives through transfer of technologies to the fringe villages around the Protected Area (Gibbon WL Sanctuary).
- To benefit both science and society through On-farm Participatory Research.
- To create an opportunity for instant and effective extension of promising packages of practices developed On-farm
- To generate awareness among different stakeholders for biodiversity conservation.
