ENT microsurgery offers simple, scar-less option Most hearing problems totally curable

Hearing impairment is a very common problem which is not only embarrassing, but leads to loss of confidence, reduced efficacy and vigour. It can be of different types. The good news is most types of deaf-ness are completely curable curable.

Impaired hearing caused by repeated infections of the nose and throat leading to collection of fluid in the middle ear can be cured by a small mi-crosurgery like my-ringotomy (a surgical procedure in which a tiny incision is created in the eardrum to retumour, chronic tonsillitis can cause ear discharge, leading to perforation and dam-age to the ossicles, in the eardrum to re-lieve pressure caused by excessive build-up

of fluid, or to drain pus from the middle ear) and grommet (tiny plastic tubes) causing hearing im-pairment. In such cases, these precipitating conditions need insertion, which pre-vents adhesion and to be treated first by simple surgeries and permanent damage to the ear. Sometimes road traffic accident trauma over the ear, then eardrum repair. so that the patien trauma over the ear, like impact or injury by a sharp object, can damage the eardrum and lead to hearing loss,' says Dr. Archa-na Ranade, ENT Sur-geon, AGH, Kolkata. 'Sometimes nasal problems like a de-viated nasal septum, adenoid, polyps, nose tumour, chronic ton

so that the patient gets permanent relief. Most of the patients neglect these symp-toms, which aggra-vate the problem, Dr. Ranade points out. Sometimes this in-fection can be dan-gerous if it spreads to the adjacent bone. After destroying the bone, it can spread to the brain. Hence, early consultation and early consultation and treatment is necessary to prevent deafness and other complica-
