RFRI Celebrates International Day for Biological Diversity-2015

Rain Forest Research Institute, Jorhat (Assam) has celebrated **International** Day for Biological Diversity-2015 at Kakojan Boys' Higher Secondary School, Kakojan, Jorhat (Assam) on 26th May, 2015 in a day-long programme in which around 350 students from 15 schools of attended.
