Exposure Visit of M. Sc. Students of West Bengal State University, Kolkata

A team of 17 M. Sc. (Botany) students from West Bengal State University, 24 Parganas (North), Kolkata under the guidance of Dr. A. K. Sarkar, Associate Professor and Head, Botany Department had an exposure visit to Rain Forest Research Institute, Jorhat (Assam) from 16th to 20th March, 2015.

On 16th April, 2015 Sri R. K. Kalita, Head, Forestry Extension Division, RFRI, Jorhat formally welcomed the Students and their Teacher to the Institute. He briefed the students about the research and development activities of RFRI through a power point presentation. It was followed by various technical sessions along with field visit and practical sessions.

He bamboo also practically demonstrated the various propagation techniques of bamboo in the nursery. The students visited the Botanical Garden and collected required plant samples for their study.

The Students also visited Gibbon Wild Life Sanctuary and Kaziranga National Park and studied its unique ecosystems.
