Visit of Students to RFRI under Gyanjyoti Programme of Government of Assam

Gyanjyoti Programme is one of the flagship programmes of Government of Assam initiated in 2004. This is the eighth year of this Programme. Under this Programme, Govt. of Assam provides all facilities to the school students to visit historically and geographically important places including industrial towns and important educational and research Institutions of Assam. The students experienced different species of rattans and bamboos conserved by RFRI in its Canetum and Bambusetum respectively. The students visited the bamboo nursery. They were also explained about recent techniques of bamboo propagation and nursery management practices. Students also visited bamboo composite centre where various machines used for bamboo handicraft sector were shown.
