## Note on Webinar on Urban Forestry organized by IFGTB under Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav

The Institute of Forest Genetics and Tree Breeding, Coimbatore organized Webinar on "Urban Forestry" for teachers / students / scholars of research and educational institutions and volunteers of NGOs who are associated in tree planting programmes on 12<sup>th</sup> November 2021. The webinar was organized under Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav to commemorate 75 years of Independence of India. The main aim of this webinar was to deliberate on choice of trees for urban forestry and discuss future strategies for the success of urban tree planting and to enhance potential of urban forestry to abate pollution and to improve quality of the urban environment.
