Significant Research Finding

ICFRE-Forest Research Institute, Dehradun

• A faunal field survey was conducted from 25–30 April 2025 in five forest locations within the 10 km influence and impact zone of the proposed coal mining block in Hazaribagh District, Jharkhand, focusing on butterflies, birds, and mammals. A total of 24 butterfly species, 74 bird species, and 13 wild mammal species were recorded, along with their relative abundance and conservation status.

ICFRE-Institute of Forest Genetics and Tree Breeding, Coimbatore

- *Melia dubia* variety GK-10 was registered under the PPV& FRA, New Delhi, in the Extant (Variety of Common Knowledge) category for a protection period of 18 years (Registration No. REG/2024/0487).
- CRISPR-Cas tools were used to generate a 1400 bp deletion in the *EcHKT1;1* gene in the challenging tree species of Eucalyptus. A tissue-preferential RNA Pol II promoter, MsPRP2, was tested for the first time in Eucalyptus to generate

the desired gene deletions using a polycistronic gRNA construct. The constructs were evaluated rapidly using pooled GFP-tagged roots induced by *Agrobacterium rhizogenes*, a method developed for Eucalyptus at ICFRE-IFGTB, as well as in plantlets generated using *A. tumefaciens* mediated transformation. The optimised gene editing methods and the MsPRP2 promoters open up new avenues for molecular breeding of Eucalyptus.
